- Students study and/or learn the meaning of vocabulary words.

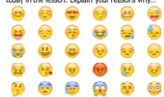

Emojis

- Comprehension
- Students use emojis to do any of the following:
 - Summarize a text
 - Demonstrate characterization
 - Symbolize events in a story
 - Converse in the perspective of a character

Debates

- Writing & Comprehension
 - Students must research BOTH sides of a topic and then the teacher chooses which side students will present.
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You Tube

- Comprehension
 - Students create their own YouTube videos to teach other students specific content.
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Kahoot

- Comprehension & Vocabulary
 - Students (or teacher) create a game to review pertinent concepts, characters, or vocabulary terms.

- Vocabulary, Comprehension & Writing
- Students view videos on specific content and answer questions embedded within the video.

Flipgrid

- Comprehension, Assessment, Peer Teaching
- Students use the [Flipgrid](#) app to create a short video clip to demonstrate knowledge and understanding of concepts, teach other students concepts, or just voice an opinion on a topic.
 - Math lessons
 - Book reviews
 - Peer teach specific concepts
 - Great for absent students to obtain information
 - Class elections
 - Feedback

Hyperdocs

- All components of a lesson and/or unit all in one place
 - Allows for differentiation
 - Allows for student choice
 - Absent students can access information
