



Licensure Updates 2022

Administrator Academy Requirement

The AA requirement is waived for FY22
Public Act 102-0730 (Effective immediately)

Professional Development Reduction

PD Hours were reduced by 20% for renewal for any renewal cycle that includes the 21-22 school year (FY 22.) Entered into ELIS as a PD entry.
Public Act 102-0852 (Effective immediately)

License Reinstatement Penalty Fee

Reduces the lapsed license reinstatement penalty fee from \$500 to \$50.
Public Act 102-0710 (Effective immediately)

Substitute Teachers

Allows substitute teachers to sub for up to 120 days (rather than 90 days) for SY 2021-22 and SY 2022-23.
Public Act 102-0717 (Effective immediately)

Short-term Substitute Teaching License

Allows an individual to teach up to 15 consecutive days (instead of 5) per licensed teacher during a disaster proclamation.
Public Act 102-0712 (Effective immediately)

Short-term Substitute Teaching License

Allows the application fee for a Short-Term Substitute Teaching License to be waived when the governor has declared a disaster due to a public health emergency.
Public Act 102-0867 (Effective immediately)

Paraprofessional License

Allows individuals to obtain an Educator License with Stipulations endorsed for Paraprofessional (ELS-PARA) at age 18 (instead of 19) if the educator will be working with students in grades PK-8.

Public Act 102-0713 (Effective January 1, 2023)

Educators enrolled in approved preparation programs

Individuals are eligible for a substitute teaching license if they have completed 90 semester hours of credit.

Public Act 102-0711 (Effective January 1, 2023)

Retired Teachers

Allows an additional 20 paid days, or 100 paid hours, to the provision that an annuitant can be employed as a teacher without impacting their retirement status.

Updated from 120 days or 600 hours to 140 days or 700 hours

Public Act 102-0709 (Effective immediately)
