Area VI McKinney-Vento Homeless Education Training



You are a vital player for your district's Homeless Education And Resource Team

Seek out your district Homeless Liaison if you **suspect** a student may be experiencing housing instability and be eligible as defined by the McKinney-Vento Law. How could you possibly know? Here are some indicators to watch for, your district liaison will make the eligibility determination.

Lack of educational continuity:

Attendance at multiple schools, gaps in skill development

Reaction or statement by parents, guardians, or student:

Avoidance of questions related to current address, Statements about staying with grandparents, other relatives, friends, or in motels & campgrounds

campgrounds

Poor Health or Nutrition: unmet medical and dental needs, respiratory problems, fatigue

Social and behavioral

concerns: a marked change in behavior, Poor/short attention span, Aggression, "Old" beyond years, School phobia (afraid to leave parent), Anxiety, especially late in the school day

Poor Hygiene:

wearing same clothes several days, inconsistent grooming Transportation or attendance problems: Erratic attendance or tardies, numerous absences, lack of participation in after school activities

Lack of personal space after school:

consistent lack of preparation for school, loss of books and supplies on a regular basis, elevated concern over personal belongings

Who is eligible by law?
All children and youth
who don't have a fixed,
regular, and adequate
nighttime residence, such
as those living:

- In an emergency or transitional shelter
- With friends or relatives due to loss of housing or economic hardship (also known as doubled up.)
- In a motel, hotel, campground, car, bus or train station or other public place, an abandoned building.
- In **inadequate**accommodations, such as
 no utilities or running
 water, no working
 kitchen,
 infestations/mold/vermin,
 number of bodies vs.
 heds
- As an Unaccompanied
 Youth, including youth
 who are not in the
 physical custody of a
 parent or guardian.

ELEPHANT IS IN THE ROOM CAMPAIGN




- 1. WHAT IS THE ELEPHANT IS IN THE ROOM CAMPAIGN?

THE 2023-2024 FAFSA IS OUT

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is the form you need to complete to receive financial aid from the federal government to help pay for college. Below is what you will need to start your FAFSA:

- FSA ID (fsaid.ed.gov) for Parent & Student
- 2021 Tax Returns for Parent & Student
- Social Security Numbers for Parent & Student
- Other Income Information
- State Issued Driver's License

Licensure

License Reinstatement

If your educator license has lapsed because you have not completed the required professional development and/or Administrators' Academy courses, you must complete any deficient professional development, enter the activities in ELIS, and submit your PD before you may reinstate your license.

Once you have satisfied the professional development requirements, you may choose one of the two following options:

- 1. Complete nine semester hours of coursework in one or more of the endorsement areas listed on your license. Coursework must be completed within the last five fiscal years. View acceptable courses you may complete for reinstatement below.
- 2. Pay a \$50 penalty fee in place of completing nine semester hours of coursework.

To apply for either reinstatement option, educators must log into their ELIS account and apply by clicking on Reinstatement in their Action Center. If the reinstatement link is not available, be sure all required professional development has been fulfilled.
