The IESE Network is committed to enhancing the effectiveness of staff who support students with disabilities through research based professional development. One of our priority topics is <u>High Leverage Practices in Special Education</u>.

Developed by the Council for Exceptional Children and the CEEDAR Center, High-Leverage Practices are 22 essential special education techniques that all K-12 special education teachers should master for use across a variety of classroom contexts. Our team provides professional learning to new and early career educators through trainings, mentoring, and coaching.
